

Curriculum: The BBT 1-2-3™ Format

BBT's curriculum is Biblically-based and applicable the day you study it. The *BBT 1-2-3*™ format enables the group to consistently fit a meeting into a busy work week (e.g. before work or over a lunch hour, etc.). The Agenda and Recap are sent through Go!Connect to help group members prepare and continue discussion for accountability.



Agenda – Introduces applicable Biblical principles



Group Leader Guide – Facilitates discussion and allows for shared leadership



Recap - Encourages community and application



LIVE: Apply Biblical principles at work

Small group discussion begins typically with prayer, reading the Agenda together for context, then reading scripture and discussing the included questions. Questions are chosen to help the members in the study apply the scripture to their workplace and lives through group discussion. The Application Question is for group application and accountability between meetings.

Sample discussion question: Read Nehemiah 7:1-3. What do these verses teach you about delegation?

<u>Sample application question</u>: In what areas of your life have you been encouraged to do some humble self-evaluation and practice repentance?



LEAD: Start a small-group Bible study

The Lead question is for holistic life application at work, home, church, and in the community.

Sample lead question: Ask Yourself: How can I have the courage to face opposition, engage in necessary confrontation, and encourage others where God has placed me?



Leadership Flywheel

BBT is more than a Bible study. It is a tool for those who work to contribute to God's great commission. (Matthew 28:19-20). More than ten years ago, a BBT board member who was an engineer, asked the founder of BBT to develop a formula for the company's vision statement – "To see people grow in their relationship with Christ, and expand God's kingdom through their leadership." The founder, a numbers guy, began to ponder about an equation. Months later, during a family vacation, he woke up in the middle of the night and wrote down his equation:



[L_1 =Learning, L_2 =Living, L_3 = $\frac{1}{2}$ adding, L_4 = $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1$

This equation reflects how a legacy could begin with one proper all produce Christ-centered spiritual leaders if people learned from God's Word, lived out what they learned, and multiplied through Christ-centered leadership shared with others.

A Legacy for the Kingdom

Many understand Christian activities such as attenting church or Bible studies as simply a spiritual workout for personal growth and health. However, if you are good through the motions and checking the boxes, are you contributing to His legacy? God tells us to seek first His King vin, of the rown and share the good news with others. BBT helps make this possible by offering a simple vizy to share His and in the mission field of the workplace. Invite others, share leadership, and humbly believe that wan you want to could have an eternal impact: a legacy for the Lord.

Before you begin, read the AGENDA LEARN introduction together and review the APPLICATION QUESTION from the previous meeting's RECAP.



LIVE

Discussion Questions: Have someone read each Bible verse aloud and then ask the corresponding question. Be sure everyone has enough time to find the Scripture before the verse is read.

1) Read <u>James 1:22-25</u>. How do you best learn: by doing, by teaching, by some other method?



James points out that if we only listen and do not live out what we are ve learned, it's like we have forgotten who we are.



God doesn't expect perfection, but rather a daily attempt to be faithful to transferription of us and others. James is reminding us that God's Word is supposed to rove e us to think of ways we can live out what we've learned. By revealing faithful responses to our life, we often opportunities to share with others how God has transformed us.

Living as one appression of God requires an understanding of His Word to be bold, honest, loving, and forgiving even when we need to have hard conversations.



There are many situations and conversations at work that can be hard to live out gracefully. For example, when there are confrontations like admitting your idea failed, having to confront a co-worker, standing up for what is the right thing to do, or being honest when the truth will be hard to hear. But, if we apply what we learn from God and live to serve Him, our responses are in His infinite power rather than our own.



Discuss some examples of how you can be empowered to live as one approved by God this week at work including asking others to come to BBT or asking your workplace for permission to use a conference room at your workplace for Bible study.

3)	Read <u>2 Corinthians 3:1-6</u> . How do these verses remove the pressure from those who lead Bible studies such as this BBT?
POINT	Christ alone converts people's hearts to live for Him, and no human can take credit for this transformation.
DEEPER	The desire to see God change lives by the fruit of the Holy Spirit is the only validation required for <i>leading</i> and facilitating others to wrestle with God's Word. Sometimes we lead well, but people don't want to follow God. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 3:23 & 6:23)

4)	Read <u>Exodus 18:17-18</u> . When have you taken on too much? How in you selp inspire others to utilize
-,	their God-given abilities?
POINT	God always wants us to be looking for ways to support and endurage others around us.
DEEPER	Sometimes holding onto too much control, at cents, there from utilizing their God-given talents, that sometimes they don't even know they have attached by eve an opportunity to stretch a bit. Delegating authority also builds trust and offer a portunities or others to learn and grow.
TIP	Shared leadership is an integral part of the <u>Assership Flywheel™</u> model exponentially expanding God's kingdom. You might ask, "love re you geted to make a difference for His kingdom?"

5)	Read Matthew 28:10-20. How are you living out Jesus' call to go and make disciples?
POINT	Jesus gave the command – an instruction, not an option, to go and make disciples.
DEEPER	God wants everything we do to build His Kingdom. BBT Groups help people grow in relationship with Jesus, which impacts your workplace, expanding God's Kingdom in ways we can't imagine. That is <i>Legacy</i> !
TIP	Most of the time, our actions make differences in ways we don't and maybe won't ever know. However, you might ask, "Has God unexpectedly revealed to you something you did that He used for His purposes?"
